

## Y5/6 Religion and Worldviews Knowledge Organiser – Christianity

### Enquiry Questions: What is the best way for a Christian to show commitment to God?

#### Tier 3 - Subject Specific Vocabulary

<b>Commitment</b>	A willingness to give your time and energy to a job, activity, or something that you believe in.
<b>Gifts of the Holy Spirit</b>	The gifts are: wisdom, understanding, guidance, strength, knowledge, devotion and fear of the lord.
<b>Prayer</b>	The act of talking to God
<b>The Lord's Prayer</b>	The prayer taught by Jesus to his disciples.
<b>Confirm</b>	To approve
<b>Confirmation</b>	Strengthening or deepening one's commitment to God.
<b>Holy Spirit</b>	The third part of the Trinity; God as spiritually active in the world.
<b>Holy Communion</b>	A Christian ceremony in which bread and wine are consumed in memory of Jesus.
<b>Eucharist</b>	Another word for the ceremony of Holy Communion
<b>Ten Commandments</b>	Laws or rules handed down to Moses by God on Mount Sinai

We are looking at ways in which Christians are committed to their faith by evaluating some key areas already studied plus the 10 commandments and Jesus' 2 commandments.

#### Key Knowledge:

- Christians believe that if they are committed to God they will display love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, self-control and not jealousy or self-importance.
- Many Christians will choose to be confirmed and in this ceremony, the gifts of the Holy Spirit are prayed to be conferred on them.
- Christians show their commitment to God in different ways. Some of these practices are more significant to some Christians than others.
- Some Christians have dedicated their lives to helping others in order to show their love and commitment to God, for example: Martin Luther King, Mother Teresa, Christian charities and even members of the local church.
