Key knowledge

- **Shabbat** happens every week from **Friday evening to Saturday**.
- Jewish families light candles to begin Shabbat.
- Children help prepare for Shabbat at home.
- Families eat special food like **challah bread**.
- People say **prayers** and spend time together.
- Shabbat is a time to **rest, be calm and be with family**.
- Many Jewish children enjoy Shabbat because it feels **special and peaceful**.
- Jewish people believe Shabbat is a **gift from God**.
