Judaism	A religion.

Prayer	Talking to God.
Shofar	A horn that is blown.
Festival	A special time or celebration.



Key knowledge

- Rosh Hashanah** is the **Jewish New Year**.
- It is a time to **think about the past year**.
- People eat **sweet foods** (like apples and honey) for a happy new year.
- A **shofar (horn)** is blown in the synagogue.
- Yom Kippur** is a time to **say sorry and be forgiven**.
- People think about their actions and try to **make things better**.
- Families go to the **synagogue** and say **prayers**.
- These festivals are very **important to Jewish children and families**.
